

Summary Report of the Discovery College School Council Tuesday 11 September 2018

The meeting commenced with Brian McCann presenting a detailed breakdown of the 2018 Diploma results and outlining the final university offers to DC students on behalf of Susie Blomfield. The DP results for 2018 are the highest yet achieved by any cohort. The DC grade average for 2018 was 35.3, against a world average of 30.0. The mean core points (for Extended Essay and TOK) increased from 2.09 last year to 2.21. This year's university placements show an increase in the number of students continuing their higher education in Hong Kong and Asia as well as a diverse choice of major. University offers included those from prestigious universities in the UK such as Cambridge, Oxford, Imperial College as well as ivy leagues schools in USA.

3. Principal's Report

Enrollment numbers for 2018-19 are slightly down on our budget figures.

Under the new changes to ESF/DC Admissions, DC has been granted an exemption which allows DC to consider the transport restrictions into Discovery Bay when processing the applications.

DC is in discussion with ESF regarding avenues of support for families living on the house boats in the DB Marina who have been asked to vacate their berths by 31 December 2018.
